He advised that some reorganization is in progress—NRCS, FSA, Risk Management, and Rural Development—however, loans are unaffected. Russ reaffirmed his commitment to the states and encouraged them to contact him if they should have any problems with their local FSA in resolving issues. He will always be available to help.
